- (d) Describe, in brief, Alam's memory of leaving Kolkata three years back.
- (e) What does the writer have to say about the decision taken by the governments of Hindustan and Pakistan with regard to lunatics?
- (f) In *For Your Lanes, My Country*, why is the poet in a state of anguish?

- (a) Discuss the theme of violence and gender with reference to two of the texts prescribed for you.

- (b) "Zakir looks back to events of his early childhood in India and the Partition from the vantage point of the experience of 1971 in Pakistan as a dual witness to momentous events, past and present." Discuss.
- (c) Examine Amitav Ghosh's representation of time and space in *The Shadow Lines*.
- (d) Comment on *A Leaf in the Storm* as a story that is an imaginative recreation of the Partition experiences of a woman caught in the terrible dilemma of womanhood.
- (e) Discuss the themes of memory and displacement in *Alam's Own House*.
- (f) Show how Manto's story, *Toba Tek Singh* captures the trauma of the Partition.
- (g) Examine how the story, *Toba Tek Singh* questions the notion of nationhood.
- (h) Analyze Gulzar's use of imagery for a poetic retelling of Manto's story, *Toba Tek Singh*.
